Make A Plan to Vote at IWillVote.com

Voting rules vary by location, but there are easy resources you can use to check your registration status, explore your voting options, and track the status of your ballot. Follow these steps to ensure your vote is counted:

- Step 1: Check Your Registration Status
 - Check your registration status. If you need to register to vote, explore your options on <u>IWillVote.com</u>





• Step 2: Decide How You Will Vote

• Choose your voting method by checking <u>iwillvote.com</u> and going to the "Learn more about voting" tab:



- Step 3: Locate Your Polling Place and Decide When You Will Vote
 - Once you decide the type of voting that makes the most sense for you, visit <u>IWillVote.com</u> to find where you need to go to vote if you choose to vote in person, either on Election Day or during the early voting period.

• Step 4: Map your Journey

- Plan your route to your chosen voting location and find a few back-up options in case any locations are closed.
- Step 5: What do you need to bring with you?
 - Go back to the "Learn more about voting tab" to see your state's ID requirements and check if your state has same-day voter registration available in case you missed the deadline or the information on file at the polling location doesn't match your ID.
 - \circ $\,$ Make a list of what you need to bring!
- Step 6: Let your work or school know if you need to make accommodations for a voting plan.
 - Or take the day or morning off, if you can! This election is a big deal!
- Step 7: Who are you bringing with you?
 - Do you have a spouse/partner? Friend? Child voting in their first election? Parent or elderly neighbor that needs help getting to the polls? Make plans with them to vote together.
- Step 8: Mark your calendar!
 - Collect all the information in one calendar invite description as a reminder to yourself and your voting partner.

Impacted by the Recent Hurricanes?

- North Carolina: Voting locations may have changed in counties across North Carolina. Register and vote at an early voting site from Oct. 17 to Nov. 2. Visit <u>ncsbe.gov/helene</u> for more information.
- South Carolina: Visit <u>scVOTES.gov</u> to download, complete, and return your voter registration form. You can also register in person at your county voter registration office.
- **Georgia:** Precincts for Georgia voters in Atkinson County, Columbia County, and Lowndes County have changed. Check your new precinct location at <u>mvp.sos.ga.gov</u> and explore the <u>resources HERE</u> for more information about absentee voting and Georgia's Voter ID requirement for all voters.
- Florida: There have been voting changes to 13 Florida counties: Charlotte, Citrus, Dixie, Hernando, Hillsborough, Lee, Levy, Madison, Manatee, Pasco, Pinellas, Sarasota, and Taylor. Voters can still vote early, but the locations may change, and the counties must announce these sites no later than 20 days before the election. Voters can request vote-by-mail ballots to be sent to alternative addresses without the usual formalities, and ballots may be sent using forwardable mail to accommodate displaced voters.
